Driving means freedom and independence. You can have that feeling again. Independent Transportation Network is a dignified transportation alternative for older people who can no longer drive. ITN Bluegrass provides rides in an automobile, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, with drivers who are trained to ensure your safety and comfort.

So, go ahead schedule your medical and hair appointment. Make that list of errands. Set up a lunch date. Let ITN help you continue living an independent, connected life on *your* terms.

- Sign up for an annual membership and set up a pre-paid Personal Transportation Account. No need to carry cash or tip drivers.
- You pay approximately half the true cost of each ride. ITN's community fund-raising efforts make up the difference to keep rides affordable.
- Rides are available for any purpose 24 hours a day for people 60 years and older and visually impaired adults under age 60. Book your ride in advance and /or share your ride to save money.
- Ride in a private automobile with a trained driver.
- Door-through-door service includes help with steps and packages, heavy doors and walkers.
- Road Scholarships are available for low-income members.

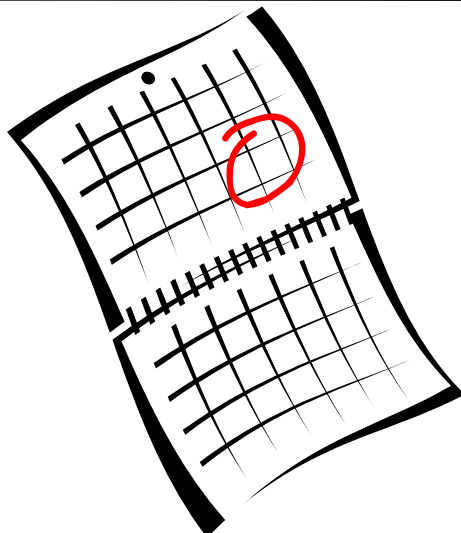
