If you wish to further your support of Baptist Health Lexington you can designate your Kroger Plus Card to BHFL. The Foundation will then receive a percentage of your purchases every time you swipe your card at the checkout. It does not cost any additional money and does not affect your fuel points.

All you need to do to participate is go online and register at www.krogercommunityrewards.com

Click **Sign In**. If you are a new online customer then click **New Account Registration**

Create a Kroger Rewards Account by entering:

your **zip code**, click on your favorite store

enter your **email and create a password**

agree to the terms and conditions

You will receive an email. Click on the link within the body of the email

Click on **My Account** and use your email address and the password you just created to proceed to the next step.

Click on **Edit Kroger Community Rewards** information and **input your Kroger Plus card number**.

Click **Update or confirm** to edit the information

Enter **Baptist Health Foundation Lexington** or our NPO #**79020** and select us from the list

To verify you are enrolled correctly, you will see your organization's name in the right side of your information page.

You must swipe your registered Kroger Plus card or use the phone number associated with the account when shopping for each purchase to count. Remember all donations given to BHFL go to fund the programs and services of Baptist Health Lexington.
